



NOTICE TO MEMBERS

Equifax Data Security Breach:

Fort McClellan Credit Union became aware of a national data security breach involving Equifax, one of the nation's three major credit reporting agencies. According to Equifax, the breach occurred from mid-May through July 2017; and has exposed 143 million American consumer's sensitive and personal information. Additional information regarding the breach is available at the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) website at www.consumer.ftc.gov.

Suggested guidance to members include taking the following provisions:

- Check your credit reports from Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion for free by visiting: www.annualcreditreport.com. Accounts or activity that you do not recognize could indicate identity theft.
- Consider placing a credit freeze on your files. Placing a credit freeze on your file makes it more difficult for someone to open a new account in your name.
- Monitor your existing credit cards and bank / credit union statements closely for charges you do not recognize.
- Consider placing a fraud alert on your file. A fraud alert warns creditors that you may be a victim of a data breach or identity theft.
